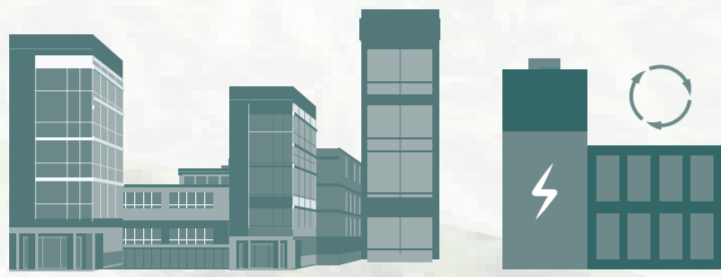


## GROUP GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS

It represents a **reduction of more than 20%** compared to 2024 and **54% since 2019!**

It amounts to **1.19 tCO<sub>2</sub>e** per employee (in FTE, for "full-time equivalent" meaning the number of people working in the company adjusted to full-time work).

## ENERGY CONSUMPTION OF BUILDINGS

After several years of continuous decline, our **energy consumption** has stabilised at a level comparable to that of 2024 (3GWh less!).

## WATER CONSUMPTION

In 2022, water consumption was approximately two million cubic metres. **This measure decreased by 7%** compared to 2024. This represents **8.39 m<sup>3</sup>** per FTE.

## BUSINESS TRIPS

Including **245 million kilometres travelled by plane**, **182 by car** and **87 by train**. In all, a slight increase of 3% in mileage compared to 2024.

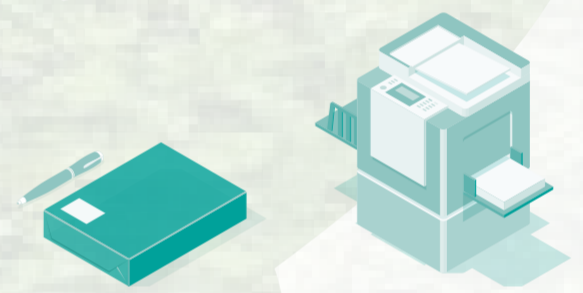

## WASTE

**43.1% of waste is recycled**, with the aim of continuing to increase recycling. In total, we calculated **6.3% more waste** in 2025 than in 2024 after a more detailed review of the data set this year. This represents **65 kilos of waste per person**.

## PAPER CONSUMPTION

**28 kilos of paper per FTE in 2025**, a decrease of **17%** (more than 1,000 tonnes!) compared to 2024. **92.5% of paper used** within the Group is certified sustainable by trusted entities such as the FSC.

Since 2017, in addition to reducing its own carbon footprint, the Group continues to purchase carbon credits every year to fully offset its residual emissions
